This guide is an opening to the hospitality of the villagers, to the immeasurable wealth of the Lebanese heritage, to the authenticity of the remnants of our past and to the sacred history of a land rich with culinary traditions

It is in this frame of serenity, but also of daily renewal that rural tourism is included. It is a return to the roots, a boarding pass for a trip without borders to a home where we taste the perfumes, savors and soul of home.

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« North people have blue eyes, a blue missing from their decoration... » But those of us at home own the blue of dreams. Situated at 1,500 meters above sea level, Jabal Qammouah is a small paradise rich with free-flowing rivers, water flows, steep mountains and robust knotted pines. It is a perfect place for hiking or pick-nicks.

Jabal Akroum or Akroum Mountain, embraces villages on its slopes, among which one named Akroum. Most of these villages have ancient remains, tombs built from stone slabs, megalithic tombs and remains of churches.

Arqa archaeological tell (hill), dating back to the Neolithic period, is renowned for its elevation: 30 to 40 m of accumulated archaeological sediments. However, its area hardly exceeds four hectares and a half at the top. Archaeological excavations undertaken on the hill since the 1970s have allowed the discovery of many structures which mainly belong to its different occupaying levels, from the early Bronze Age (1200 - 3000 BC) to the Mamluk era.

Qobayyat, a very busy city nowadays, was hundred years ago a quiet village renowned for its silk crafts. Of those days, there are only two remains in Qobayyat: the old abandoned silk mill and the Daher family manor.

The permanent scientific museum of Qobayyat includes, among its scientifically taxidermied collections, more than 400 specimens of birds and other animals living on the Lebanese territories. There are also more than 4,000 butterflies from all over the world.

Akkar is a region similar to the Singing Mermaids ... It invites you to travel, and encourages its discovery. It entombs the passers of green shoots blooming gently, water that sleeps calmly, and fine grasses and flowers all over the place. It offers everything – so generously – to whoever confides in her on his/her path ... Akkar is there, in the middle of innate greenery, as a symbol of hope.



The temples of Sfireh are locally known as Qal'at al Hosn. It is one of the largest cultural sites in Lebanon with more than four temples, a number of columned altars and other religious structures.

What makes Sir Ed Danniyeh attractive, better known as Sir, is its orchards and flowers; because it's a village where water flows everywhere & anywhere. This fabulous village is renowned for its outdoor restaurants and its hotels.

The heights of Mrebbine and Wadi Jhannam Valley contain the majority of forest trees types which exist in Lebanon including cedars, pines, oaks and willows, in addition to the majority of plants types found in Lebanon and in the Middle-East. It is an area where animals and birds live all year round, a rare event as it ranges between 1600m and 2800m above sea level.

The mountainous region of Ouyoun el Samak is home to waterfalls and a beautiful artificial lake. It is an ideal place for hikes and picnics. Ouyoun el Samak means «sources of fish», and its sources feed Nahr al Bared river, dammed to produce hydroelectric power.

A bit closer to authenticity, Danniyeh offers a space beyond time, few moments closer to nature and the natural, and a momentum of dynamism, beyond routine and everyday life.

Tripoli, is, undeniably, the second capital of Lebanon. Its history seems to have begun in the 9th century BC when the Phoenicians established a small trading post in Al Mina sector.

Tripoli is home to countless remains, including some forty monuments, mostly dating from the 14th century. There are a dozen Mamluk and Ottoman mosques, so many madrassas or Koranic schools and a number of khans, or caravanserais, as well as hammams or public baths, which perpetuate the layout of Roman and Byzantine baths. As for the souks, they constitute – with khans – a space where tailors, jewelers, perfumers, tanners, soap manufacturers and other traders and professionals, gather in an environment that has hardly changed since the Middle Ages. Tripoli is famous for its Arabic pastries, olive oil soap, silverware and flattened copper objects. Whoever undertakes this visit to Tripoli indulges in setting his senses in motion: the taste, the smell and the touch, as in a dream of Arabian one thousand and one Nights; a dream that carries, takes and transports us to Al Mina port, dreaming of other escapes, because we know we have to leave one day only to return better. A tribute to all those who came back...

In Tripoli, two military buildings break through: Saint-Gilles Castle, dating back to the time of Crusades, and the Tower of Lions in Al Mina sector: it was built by the Mamluks and intended to defend the coast against maritime incursions.

Palm Islands Nature Reserve is a group of three small limestone islands situated a few miles off the coast of Tripoli. These UNESCO protected areas give sea turtles and threatened seals a sanctuary of great interest as well as a refuge for a temporary stopover for migratory birds.

Qui dit bleu dit Enfeh. Le grand bleu, les bleus au cœur qui façonnent les artistes de la vie, le bleu du ciel épousant la mer dans un souffle d'éternité et les moulins à vent des pensées vagabondes... Tout est là. Dans le bleu de la pure immensité...

Petite ville de pêcheurs sur la côte du nord du Liban à l'origine construite sur une péninsule étroite et rocheuse, Enfeh est la seule ville sur la côte orientale de la Méditerranée à être taillée dans un environnement rocheux. On raconte ques cette ville fut le premier site de culture, de sel marin.

Enfeh évolue aussi avec le temps, tout en gardant cet aspect authentique propre à elle; Taht el-Rih, «Sous le Vent», est une plage de rochers avec de petits chalets en bois blanc et turquoise accueillant aujourd'hui touristes et Libanais touristes dans leur pays. Dans cet endroit historique, pêcheurs locaux et marins se rencontraient.

Sur le versant sud, Deir al-Natour, le monastère du Gardien se dresse sur un promontoire face à Enfeh, avec son joli cloître intérieur. Enfeh abrite également un certain nombre d'églises anciennes, dont la plus ancienne, Notre-Dame du Vent (Saydet el Reeh) contient des restes de ses fresques byzantines originales.

Enfeh est aussi le pied à terre de l'unique église romane du Liban, Sainte Catherine, construite par les Croisés ainsi que celui de l'une des grandes réussites d'ingénierie du Moyen Age: les Croisés (ou Phéniciens) y ont creusé un énorme fossé protecteur au niveau de la mer tout au long de la péninsule, s'étendant sur plus de 100 mètres à travers la roche.

A proximité du village de Hamat, sur le massif de Ras ach-Chaq'a, se dresse le monastère Grec Othodoxe, Deir Saydet an-Nouriyyeh, ou Notre-Dame des Lumières, construit entre le 17ème et le 19ème siècles. Parlant de bleu, le bleu là-bas est royal au vrai sens du terme. D'une couleur perçante, immaculée, vivante.

Le panorama est à couper le souffle. La structure du monastère est cloîtrée autour d'une cour intérieure, et l'église est située sur un côté de la basilique. Des escaliers raides descendent des falaises du monastère jusqu'à une petite église construite dans une grotte creusée dans la falaise et exposée au vent salvateur de la mer.

Qalamoun, au sud de Tripoli est devenu un centre de travail du cuivre après que les artisans tripolitains eurent quitté leur traditionnel Souk an-Nahhassin, il y a quelques décennies. La route principale qui traverse la localité est bordée d'ateliers et de boutiques où les batteurs de cuivre exposent leur production de bols, chandeliers, plateaux, cruches et autres objets traditionnels.

Blessed by gods, adored by men... Breath of Life on lost collarless days, Bcharré represents the reunion with a lost paradise.

Filled by Arz El Rab (the Cedars of God) – an ideal place for hiking and all kinds of skiing activities – the cultural village of Bcharré stands, majestic over the years, at 1400 meters of altitude. It crowns the valley of Qadisha whose name derives from a Semitic root meaning «holy», and which is listed as a World Heritage Site by UNESCO. Full of caves and rock shelters inhabited since the 3rd millennium until the Roman period, the valley was dotted with chapels, hermitages and rock monasteries during the medieval period. To be discovered on your feet inch by inch and in baby steps.

Bcharré is also the birthplace of the great poet and painter Gibran Khalil Gibran, its forests retain the words he has written: "If you reveal your secrets to the wind you should not blame the wind for telling the trees". Who could keep such a huge love undisclosed? The love for this corner of Lebanon which holds the museum dedicated to Gibran in its hollow, and adjacent to his burial site in the rupestral monastery of Mar Sarkis.

Certainly, do not miss the village of Hasroun, perched on a cliff overlooking Qadisha valley, elegant with its redtiled houses, gardens and old churches.

Hadath el Jebbeh, is one of the oldest villages in the region, its name is confirmed since the 6th century of the Christian era. Marked trails link Hadath el Jebbeh with the Cedars Forest, the Holy Valley and Makmel Mountain. (Hadatheliebbeh.com)





As for its beach, it attracts sportsmen for all kinds of offshohre activities ... and wordsurfers. Inspired by poets, its Phoenician wall resists timecaused erosion and remains facing the waves of history. Batroun has the sea embedded it its History. Its road is paved with special tasting lemonade, as well as wine and good intentions. Nature gives passersby gifts with thousands of colors and odors. They stay there for a short time, a while to inhale a breath of life ... before continuing their journey to the nature reserve of Tannourine Cedars Forest, where everything lives and vibrates. Embracing rock cellars or mountain tulips, the forest offers an exquisite destination for amateur hikers. (Arztannourine.org)

With its red-tiles covered houses, Douma dominates the long and rich valley of Kfar Hilda. While strolling in its old souk – dating back to more than three hundred years ago – do not miss the sarcophagus which dates back to the IV century of the Christian era and is located in the village square.

Behind one of the inviting doors of the village, remains the room of the old cinema from the 1950s ... A cultural window at the end of the way. The villages are inspiring; On one hand, Asiya known for handmade pottery; and on the other hand, Rachana which has become a vast open-air museum where the Basbous Brothers, famous sculptors, have installed their workshops and sculptures.





Jbeil or Byblos carries in itself the charms of time and of the East. Byblos reflects an important cultural place. One of the oldest inhabited cities in the world, Byblos is a rare pearl among archaeological sites. Dating back to the 6th millennium BC, it opens its ancient through times eras. Its residential neighborhoods make a wink at the Middle Ages, and its richness oh historic sites and remains resurrects bygone eras in the hearts of its visitors.

Port of Byblos – main attraction for tourists and photographers – is the updated image of the ancient port. It has been used by Phoenicians since the Bronze Age to export cedar woods to Egypt to make ships...

A little higher than time waves & foams, and shells filled with mermaid legends, the thick forests of the nature reserve in Bentael carpeted with wildflowers, and dense pine woods make it an ideal site for migratory birds such as eagles and hawks, as well as a nice destination for bird lovers. (Bentaelreserve.org)

A little closer to the skies, Ehmej has built hiking trails and a natural site for the protection of endemic flowers. (ehmej.org)

Also, villages having an attraction of great rare and outstanding value are close at dreams: Laqlouq winter and summer Resort. The wild landscapes, the splendid formations of Laqlouq region and its ski resort attract visitors and hikers eager for tranquility and serenity, as well as winter sports enthusiasts. At Laqlouq, time stops, just to list the constellations, to count the stars within reach, and to close your eyes and spin with them...

From Afqa cave springs the sacred Adonis River currently known as Nahr Ibrahim River. In Greek mythology, the site tags the place where Adonis – legendary half-god of beauty and desire – died at the bottom of the falls. Afqa is also a site built in tribute to the goddess Venus, mother and mistress of the young half-god.

Near Aqoura village, there is a natural bridge under which flow the waters of Roueiss Cave, a destination for adventurous tourists and speleologists. et les spéléologues.



Baskinta village in Metn region certainly lives up to its Syriac name which means the house of wisdom. It is a natural fortress surrounded by 3 mountains: Zaarour, Sannine and Qanat Bakiche. It is also the birthplace of Mikhail Naimeh, one of the greatest Lebanese thinkers & men of letters, and companion of Gibran Khalil Gibran. He wrote a good part of his monumental work in a hut of fences that he had built in the middle of a "chakhroub"; a rocky landscape with extraordinary shapes, carved by corrosion and rain.


«Often you will judge your road impassable, dark and without a companion. Have the will to follow your way till the end; and at every turn, you will find a new companion», Naimeh writes. His words, which come from afar, remain anchored in the depths of each welcoming glance, from each invitation of the villagers to everyday passers-by, from each hand gesture and waving of children who run in the alleys ... to the turning points of their future lives.

Also, Mtein village witnessed its true golden age under the reign of Abillama Emirs, during the 18th and 19th centuries. Three patrician residences dating back to this period overlook the main square, Al Midane, including the Old Palace of Justice. Mtein is classified as a historic site. (Mtein.org)

Built in 1690, in the village of Khenchara, St. John Monastery is the site of the first Arab Press, which printed its first publication in 1734. For hundreds of years, the cellar of the monastery has produced sweet wines, following a classical monastic style, and before the modernization and expansion of its production to include all types of wine.

In addition to its traditional houses, Beit Chabab village retains two artisanal activities: pottery craft, focusing mainly on the production of large jars, used for the conservation of olive oil or Arak, as well as the bell foundry according to inherited familial technique.



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

Hammana town, located in Baabda heights is a cultural place of high importance. Like other Lebanese landscapes, it has a personality with thousand colors: the natural style of a Lebanese village that invites you back to the roots, and the urban set of nightlife and entertainment that invites you to travel. It includes many natural resources, like the Shaghour waterfall, apples, cherries, «fasoliya hemmaniye» (a typical red bean stew) ... Hammana was once very active in the production of silk, and a large silk mill of the 19th century transformed into a school, still exists nowadays.

A little further stands Aabadiyeh, a charming village still preserving its steep streets, its Midane

or public square, and its magnificent mansions built in the traditional style of the Emir period (18th-19th centuries). A path down the village leads to a beautiful umbrella pine forest. Its brooms dot the streets and their smell carries passersby into a small corner of dreams ... Spring of life.

In the valley, east of Hazmieh, are located the remains of Qanater Zubaidah, a Roman aqueduct built on Beirut River. This monument, originally 240 meters long, retains only a few of its piers and arches on either sides of the river. Yet ... all the charm remains present.

Located at 17 kilometers above Beirut, the city of Aley basks in the sun with fresh maritime bursts, making the air temperate and soft. A panoramic view stretches over the lush pine forests and the red tile roofs scattered over the landscape on the winding slopes leading to the shores of the Mediterranean.

Its cold and quiet winters create a feeling of interior calm similar to that of a familial and warm atmosphere. However, Aley is alive with life and joy for the rest of the year. Its lively streets, souks, luxury hotels, antique shops, cafes, restaurants, clubs, pubs, shopping malls and nightlife are teeming with life.

Just like Aley, Bhamdoun and Sofar are legendary resorts. These regions have mostly had their glory years during the pre-war period ... and they live again today. They are reborn from their past with as much enthusiasm that we hear them almost singing. Their trees bend over the passage of passersby under the command of the wind whistling loudly, while the brooms greet the visitors by painting their lives in yellow.

Abey is a village with medieval origins, although one can find in its surroundings some remains of ancient civilizations. The village also bears traces of Tannoukhi





Emirs, descendants of an Arab tribe settled in this region by the Abbasids in the middle of the 8th century. Among the monuments left by these feudal dynasts, the Fountain of the Emirs, the Residence of Emir Qa'dan At-Tannoukhi (17th - 18th centuries), the Residence of Sheikh Riad Amine Eddine and the Tomb (Maqam) of Sayyed Abdallah At-Tannoukhi, important place of Druze pilgrimage of the late 15th century (arounf 1479).

Jisr el-Qadi, now known for its pottery craft, takes its name from a bridge (jisr) built on the Damour River by Emir Zayn ad-Din al-Tannoukhy, judge (qadi) of Ain Ksour north of 'Abey during the Mamluke era.

Richmaya, whose houses are strung along the road that crosses it, is a peaceful village where walks have the taste of a free and wild youth. During carefree wanderings, rocky tombs grow on the hillsides. The Saint-Antoine De Sir Monastery, dating from the early 18th century and belonging to the Lebanese Maronite monks, the church Mar Qiriaqos (Saint-Cyriaque), and the old house of Geagea Abi Farah, are also classified as historical monuments.



The natural reserve of the Cedars of Chouf enthrones atop the highest mountains of the Middle East is. With oak forests on its northern slopes and juniper and oak forests on its southeastern slopes, it is one of the most important cedar platforms: rich flora, a plethora of medicinal plants, and fascinating wildlife. There are four main entrances to the Cedar Reserve at Ain Zhalta-Bmohray, Barouk, Maasser el Chouf and Niha.

Chouf Biosphere Reserve, with its 24 villages, is a very popular destination for hiking and trekking, bird watching, mountain biking, and snowshoeing. All means are good to have a taste of this region of Mount Lebanon, so pure and so grandiose at the same time. Rich in History and its little stories, Chouf remains majestic, through time. (shoufcedar.org - authenticshouf.com)

Beiteddine Palace stands unshakeable reflecting all the majesty of this place. It took Emir Bashir Chehab II thirty years to build it while he ruled Mount Lebanon for more than half a century. The palace is a typical example of the Lebanese architecture of the 19th century.

Deir el Qamar town, «Monastery of the Moon,» is an exceptionally preserved traditional city. From the 16th to the 18th century, it was the residence of the Lebanese governors. It is home to several historical and cultural sites, including Midane Square, Fakhreddines 15th-century Masjid, Fakhreddine II Palace, and the 17th century Deir el Qamar Synagogue.

In addition, the resorts of Jiyeh and Damour remain trendy destinations for beach lovers, and offer an escape in turquoise waves, white sand, golden rays and sunset to the eyes, bodies and souls...





There, beauty is Queen, especially in the spring when the cool breeze comes to ignite the hearts and where the flourishing trees, the flowers and the greenery celebrate Love.»







On the coast, towards the south, Saida is the third region of Lebanon by its area. There, everything is sea and sun. Even winters keep a melody in the heart and clouds illuminate souls with too much breath of life.

Saida, or Sidon, has a fascinatina and unique history. One of the most powerful states amona Phoenician cities, it has gained international prominence because of its glass production and the invention of purple, which has always been synonymous with royalty.

The visit to the old town can begin with the Castle of the Sea, a fortress built by the Crusaders during the 13th century on an island connected to the shore by a narrow bridge of 80 meters long.

On both sides of the winding and arched allevs of Saida souks, stand these exotic dream places where spices, fruits and fish are sold. There is also the craft of copper and metal. The atmosphere is rich in colors and activities, punctuated by the echoes of the merchants' voices and the streams of oriental music that escape here and there.

At the entrance to Shakrieh souk, a narrow and arched staircase leads directly into the inner courtyard of the Debbané palace. Built in 1721, this building has retained influences from Mamluke and Western Arab-Ottoman architecture.

In Moutran Street or Chakrieh souk to the south, the Audi Foundation has decided to develop the family soap factory into an ultra modern ethnographic museum illustrating the different stages of the manufacture of traditional soap based on olive oil.

To the right of the castle of the sea, Khan el Franj, or the Caravanserai of foreigners, one of the many hotel establishments built by Fakhr ed-Din II in the early seventeenth century, is now restored into exhibition halls.



The city of Nabatieh is the capital of Jabal Amel region in the south of the country. As our lives are made of these small everyday gestures and these great customs that defy time, Nabatieh is not excluded.

Every Monday, traders and visitors from nearby villages gather in the city center to trade their goods in a market known as Souk Al-Tanen or Monday market.

The city also participates in annual ceremonies commemorating the Battle of Karbala in memory of the martyrdom of Imam al-Husayn.

Nabatieh is also home to several scholars internationally renowned such as theologian Sheikh Aref al-Zein and scientist Hassan Kamal al-Sabbah.

The museum of Mleeta relates the story of resistance to the occupation of southern Lebanon from 1982. It is a fairly modern museum, well designed, with aerial and underground installations dotted with remnants of war such as captured tanks and a wide variety of ammunition.

It is a place that speaks, breathes and tells our story. To all those who are thirsty for dates, proofs and truths, the site offers information to passersby, because of its experience and its memories. All endures. Everything stays.

On a hill overlooking the southern part of the Bekaa Valley are the moss-covered remains of the Beaufort Crusader Castle. The historical site is called Shqif-Arnoun, the word «shqif» meaning in Syriac «the high rock». Although it seems inaccessible, this rocky fortress could be accessed from the village of Arnoun situated at about seven kilometers southeast of Nabatieh. The castle is surrounded by a trench and archaeological remains of an ancient village of similar architecture. Although mostly in ruins, the castle is misleading. Its labyrinthine passages are more expansive than they seem to be from the outside and the view through its many parapets is truly breathtakina.

Châtelaine du Liban, written in 1924, and filmed in 1934. »



To the south of Sidon, Tyre was classified, in 1979, as a UNESCO World Heritage Site for its important archaeological remains mainly Roman, but also Phoenician, Greek and Byzantine. There are two main sites in Tyre: the racetrack on the mainland, and the old town on the island side. Ras al-Ain spring – situated at six kilometers to the south – has religiously provided fresh water to the city for thousands of years. It was even used to serve the Roman aqueducts that extended all the way back to the metropolis.

The Nature Reserve on the Coast of Tyre covers the most beautiful sandy beaches of the country. It is a wetland that provides an important resting place for migratory birds, some of which are endangered species.

The reserve is home to many species of wetland plants and birds that thrive in such environments, and is also one of the few remaining sites for endangered green and loggerhead turtles. In addition, its artesian wells are an important source of drinking water.

"What beautifies the desert is that it hides a well somewhere." - The Little Prince, Antoine de Saint Exupery. How many wells hides Tyre, and how many times did we go to drink at its source ... Typical cakes, knéfé (Lebanese sweets) smells of souks and colors of life, all enough to satiate the passers-by.

Hasbaya, capital of Wadi al Taym, is an attractive historical city. Much of the history of Lebanon took place in the citadel of Emirs Chehabs. Today, this property is still shared by fifty family members; some of them consider it as their permanent residence.

Hasbaya jealously protects its traditions. In its workshops, talented craftsmen take care of the artisanal production of traditional clothes; Abayas, caftans and turbans of all kinds transmit life energy in their threads.

Remains of a caravanserai, or the Khan dating from 1350, nest in the vicinity of Hasbaya. This is where nowadays, every Tuesday a popular outdoor market opens and is known as Souk El Khan.

In this simplicity of life, close to the essence and the core, Wadi al Taym – a long and fertile valley – spawns an existence and extends along the western slope of Mount Hermon. Irrigated by Hasbani River, the small hills of this valley are covered with rows of green-silvered olive trees which constitute the main source of income of the region rich in honey, pine nuts, vines, figs and other fruits.

The name Rachaya el Fokhar means Rachaya-Pottery. Nowadays, two pottery workshops are operational there. Therefore, the objects on sale are the «Douaiks» or sandstone jars that preserve the freshness of the water. Another popular item is the magic jug; the water is filled by the perforated base or the top opening, but it can only be poured through the spout-shaped neck. Discovering the art of pottery is also to indulge in a tactile and natural experience, to make contact with nature and to renew oness belonging to the earth. A back to the roots.


Lebanon has one of the oldest wine cultures in the world. It dates back to 5000 years, from the vineyards of the Phoenicians who exported their wine to ancient Egypt, Rome, Greece and Carthage; which was the introduction of vine growing and oenology to the world.

The vineyards and cellars of the West Beqaa are a must-visit on the wine route in Lebanon. Indeed, the Beqaa valley is an exceptional site for the wine growing.

Ammiq Marshes, part of Chouf Biosphere Reserve, constitute the last important wetland in Lebanon, a remnant of vast swamps and lakes that once covered BeqaaValley. This natural site remains a wintering place for migratory birds passing between Europe and Africa. The site has been designated as an important area for bird conservation. Noteworthy species include globally threatened black-winged

glareola, ferruginous duck, white pelican and large snipe.

No words can describe this generous abundance of the earth over there ... so close to our hearts! Located on the foothills of Mount Sannine, on the edge of Bekaa shelf, Zahlé is located at 945m of altitude. During winter, the surrounding mountains are covered with snow while summer climate is cool and dry.

The city center stretches along both banks of the Bardawni River. The old city is on the heights of the west river bank, while the commercial area occupies the east river bank. At the northern end of the city, Wadi el Arayesh (the valley of the vines) is known for its outdoor restaurants along the stream. It is with pride that the Zahliot nickname their city by the «City of Wine and Poetry»: more than 50 poets, thinkers and writers were born there in the twentieth century and a large number of varieties of wines and Arak are produced in the region.

Cultivated valleys or virgin lands marry the remains of ancient times and keep track of Yesterday anchored within the heart of Tomorrow. Located at the foot of the Anti-Lebanon mountains – near one of the main sources of Litani River – the site of Anjar occupies a privileged place on the road map of Ancient and Medieval Bekaa.

With Baalback Mosque dating from the same period, Anjar is the only Lebanese site dating from the Umayyad period, one of the most prestigious in Arab history which reigned from 660 to 750 AD.

Although they had to rule an empire with multiple and diverse cultures and traditions, the Umayyad caliphs remained closely linked to the Bedouin tribes who ensured their control over these vast territories. Thus, they did not hesitate to leave their capital Damascus – during spring – to go to the borders of the Syrian Desert to indulge in hunting with these tribes and to listen to their poets or their storytellers.

Gradually, the caliphs began to get used to staying at the edge of the desert in fixed residences that were both hunting lodges and resorts as well as fortresses, centers of farming, as well as radiation and dissemination of an urban lifestyle likely to attract the Bedouin to settlement. Anjar was founded as part of this policy.

Anjar was built by Caliph al-Walid I ibn «Abd al-Malik» (715-705). In 744, the site was destroyed by Marwan II after his victory over Ibrahim, son of Al-Walid, in a battle for power that took place near the site.


At the crossroads of ancient roads that linked the Mediterranean coast to the Syrian interior and northern Syria to northern Palestine, the temples of Baalbeck can rightly be among the wonders of the ancient world. Classified as UNESCO World Heritage site and overlooking Bequa valley, they testify to the culmination of an imperial project symbolizing the Roman will, wealth and power.

The cultural complex of Baalbeck consists of three main monuments: Jupiter Sanctuary, the adjacent Bacchus Temple and the round temple of Venus.

Time passes, and Baalbeck stands straight. As if its columns touched the sky, as if they paid tribute to the sun ... And you cannot lift your head up without blinking. Even the golden rays are jealous of the look towards these majestic columns, so large in their own way of existence, to resist, and that one feels reduced in one instant to the tininess of the human being ... Glory to the columns of Baalbeck, which feel close to eternity.

The Yammouneh Nature Reserve is located on an east slope between the Makmel and Mnaytra mountains. It provides abundant water, supplying 84 natural sources, four permanent watercourses and

two seasonal streams. Traces of ancient civilizations are still scattered, including Phoenician and Arab monuments, a Roman temple, and some Byzantine ruins.



From Hellenistic and Roman times, Hermels most famous monument is undoubtedly Qamouh El Hermel, a 26m tower erected over a princely tomb from the 1st or 2nd century BC, at the top of a rocky hill at 2km from the city of Hermel. This building consists of a lower floor decorated with hunting scenes and an upper floor decorated with pilasters surmounted by lonic tents and a pyramidal cover.

Next to the sources of the Orontes, in the surroundings of the city of Hermel, stands out Deir Mar Maroun, a set of caves carved into the rock and arranged on three levels. Dating from the 6th and 7th centuries, this site would have been a temporary refuge for the disciples of Saint Maroun, founder of the Maronite community. The caves were later fortified by the Arabs.
